Annual Road Safety Week-2016 Celebrations

As part of Annual Road Safety Week-2016 celebrations, an Interactive Workshop on "Road Safety Through Innovation & Usage of New Technologies" was organized by Delhi Traffic Police in association with the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM) on 13th Jan 2016 at India Habitat Centre, Lodhi Road from 1100 hrs onwards.

Sh. Sharad Agarwal, Jt. CP/Traffic; Sh. Pradip Hota, Addl. CP/Traffic – HQ; Sh. Rajeev Lochan, Director, Ministry of Road Transport & Highways and MS. Meenakshi Kukreja, Dy. Director SIAM graced the occasion. Keeping in view the increasing concern over the incidence of road accidents, this Interactive Workshop was organized to showcase the use of technology in various facets of traffic management and vehicle safety to ensure safety of road users.

Sh. Sharad Agarwal, Jt. CP/Traffic showcased the presentation on the innovations and technologies being used by Delhi Police in general and Delhi Traffic Police in particular to enhance safety on roads and deter road users from indulging in traffic violations. Delhi Police has introduced several user friendly applications for the convenience of public.

- Sh. Ajoy Shah, Head Safety JK Tyre through their presentation stressed on the role of tyres in the safety of vehicles. He showcased the various improvements being introduced in tyre technology and the nuances of tyre safety which every vehicle driver should be aware of.

Sh. Arun Lakshman, Director, IDTR, stressed on the importance of skill, knowledge and attitude in ensuring safe driving on roads. He stated that the IDTR training modules have been framed methodically to bring out the best drivers on roads.

One of the major innovations being used by them is an application based software namely P-Drive system which will help in monitoring the driver behavior thereby increasing driver efficiency.
