Inauguration of Annual Road Safety Exhibition – 2016
at Traffic Pavilion Pragati Maidan

The Annual Road Safety Exhibition with the theme **“KNOW ROAD SAFETY-AVOID ROAD MISHAPS”** was inaugurated at Traffic Pavilion Pragati Maidan on the occasion of India International Trade Fair – 2016, in a special function by Sh. Alok Kumar Verma, the Commissioner of Police Delhi. Senior Delhi Police officers graced the occasion. The welcome address was given by Sh. Taj Hassan Spl. Commissioner of Police/Traffic. Sh.
