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“Drive Smart, Stay Safe – Towards a Safer Delhi!”

Delhi Traffic Police Expands Road Safety Awareness Across the Capital

In a steadfast commitment to building safer roads and encouraging responsible driving behavior, the Delhi Traffic Police, under the leadership of Shri Satya Vir Katara, Additional Commissioner of Police (Traffic Headquarters), has launched a series of extensive Road Safety Awareness Programmes across Delhi. These initiatives engaged a wide spectrum of citizens — including students, cyclists, auto/taxi drivers, public transport staff, and daily commuters — with a focus on traffic rule compliance, women’s safety, and the importance of disciplined road usage.

Involving Young Citizens – Shaping Responsible Road Users





As part of the implementation of the recommendations made during the DGSP/IGSP Conference 2024, the Delhi Traffic Police has taken an innovative step by actively involving school students in road safety and traffic management awareness. Under this drive, a total of 762 students from Govt. co-ed Sn. Sec. School, SKV (TKD Village), Delhi International School (Dwarka Sec-8), Guru Nanak Public School (Panjabi Bagh), Maharaja Agarsen Public School (Ashok Vihar),

G.G.S.S.S. (BC Block Sultanpuri), G.S.K.V.(Mundka), G.B.S.S.S. (Sec-24 Rohini), Vivekanand School (Ananad Vihar Delhi-92 Shahdara), PM Shri K.V. (Tughlaqabad), St. Lawrence Convert School (Geeta Colony), Atal Adarsh Vidyalaya (Fule Bhai margsangli mess), Guru harkrishan Public School (India Gate), SV Rouse Avenue (DDU Marg), Virender Public School(Timarpur), Atal Adarsh Vidyalaya (Kidwai Nagar) and G.L.T. Saraswati Bal Mandir (Nehru Nagar) visited the Traffic Training Park.

During the visit, students were given practical knowledge of traffic management at intersections, learning how signals, signage, and lane discipline work in real-time. Experienced Traffic Inspectors and Road Safety Cell staff guided them through interactive demonstrations, safety drills, and real-life scenarios to explain the importance of rule compliance, pedestrian safety, and disciplined road usage. The initiative not only provided hands-on learning but also motivated the young participants to act as ambassadors of road safety in their schools and neighborhoods, thereby strengthening the culture of safe mobility across Delhi.

Empowering NCC Cadets – Leaders of Tomorrow



Another significant step was a dedicated road safety programme NCC Cadets visited at the Traffic Training Park, Baba Kharak Singh Marg, aimed at grooming disciplined young citizens. Over 46 NCC cadets of Air Wing Camp, KV Sec-8, R.K. Puram, along with officers took part in the event, where they were sensitized about traffic rules, safe mobility practices, and the importance of discipline as both pedestrians and future drivers.

Special Training Program for DTC Drivers





A series of specialized training programs for DTC drivers were conducted at the Auditorium of the Traffic Training Park, Punjabi Bagh with the objective of enhancing road safety, promoting safe driving practices, preventing accidents, and improving communication skills. The sessions also included CPR first aid training and demonstrations on the functioning of RLVD/OSVD systems, delivered by experts from various faculties.

In total, 180 DTC drivers were sensitized and motivated at Punjabi Bagh. The training covered critical aspects of road safety such as safe braking techniques, pedestrian protection, compliance with traffic laws, and courteous behavior towards passengers.

Acknowledging the crucial role of public transport drivers, the Delhi Traffic Police organized these specialized programs to strengthen safety standards and ensure that the thousands of citizens who rely on public transport every day can travel more safely.

Senior officers, including Special CP Traffic Shri Ajay Chaudhary and Shri Satya Vir Katara, Additional Commissioner of Police (Traffic Headquarters), appreciated the efforts of the Road Safety Cell in successfully conducting these initiatives. They emphasized that such campaigns are crucial for instilling discipline, fostering safer driving habits, and ensuring better compliance with traffic regulations across Delhi.
